### **3:34 Summer Learning Opportunities for Students:**

- For the last few years, the district has provided learning over the summer
  - Every student, K-5, gets a summer book kit
  - K-4 have incentives for the summer reading books
- We sent home a paper copy today to parents asking if they want to “opt in” to keep their student computers over the summer to continue working on their

computers/educational programs over the summer. Students should be able to access their student apps and utilize school programs as long as they know their sign in info

### **3:37 Lee County Schools Proximity Plan (PIE):**

- Dr. G discussed PIE's school capacity.
  - We are nearing capacity at our school
  - We thought (at our last meeting) that only a certain section of the West Zone could attend our school, but that is incorrect. ANYONE from LEE COUNTY can attend PIE
  - Currently we have 9 students attending from off island for the 2024-2025 school year
  - Carlyn mentioned the bridge in front of Yucatan will be "cut in half" and will be down to one lane for 7-9 months!! Supposed to begin beginning of June
  - Tonya asked about students coming to PIE with waivers, could our school still ask those families to attend a school closer to their home? Dr. G said that is still accurate
  - We have been sending MANY REMINDERS To Kindergarten parents to enroll their Kindergarten age children as soon as possible so the district has accurate information for our enrollment
