- Students are excited to come! Thank you teachers for your help with this!

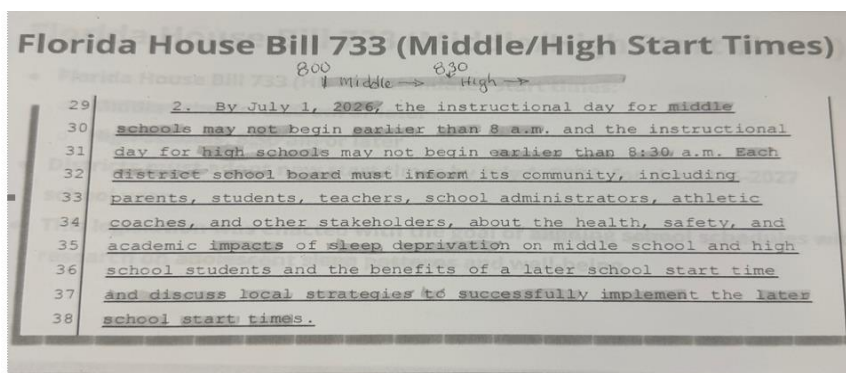
### **3:40 CAMPUS updates:**

## Florida House Bill 733 (Middle/High Start Times)

- Florida House Bill 733 (HB 733) mandates start times:
  - Middle Schools: 8:00 am or later
  - High Schools: 8:30 am or later
- Districts must adopt new start times by July 1, 2026, for the 2026-2027 school year.
- This legislation was enacted with the goal of aligning school schedules with research on adolescent sleep patterns and well-being.

## Current Start Times

- The implementation of Florida House Bill 733 will require significant adjustments to the current start times for all schools in the district. *all adjustments impact K-12*

Level	Start Time	Number of Schools
High	7:05am <i>8:30 must change</i>	15
Elementary (Early) and Combination Schools (K-8)	7:55am	31
Elementary (Late)	8:55am	17
Middle	9:45am	17

## Impact (Elementary & K-8 Schools)

- HB 733 does not mandate changes for elementary or K-8 schools.
- Middle and high school start time shifts may impact elementary schedules due to shared bus routes.
- A later high school start could require earlier elementary start times to optimize transportation logistics.

## Impact (Middle Schools)

- Middle schools currently start at 9:45 a.m., meeting HB 733's 8:00 a.m. minimum.
- No changes are required, but an earlier start may be considered to align with high school and transportation needs.
- The possibility of adjusting middle school start times closer to 8:00 a.m. may need to be explored to accommodate changes in transportation and high school schedules.

## Considerations

- **Transportation Coordination:** Optimize bus routes for new middle and high school start times while minimizing impact on elementary schedules.
- **Community Impact:** Different start times may challenge families with children in multiple school levels.
- **Academic and Operational Planning:** Adjust schedules to maintain strong academics and after-school opportunities.
